





Our Spring 2 topic will be Wizard School!



Our new topic for Spring 1 is Dinosaurs!

This half term we are looking at **dinosaurs.** We will talk about how they lived millions of years ago and are now **extinct**. We will find out more about Mary Anning, a palaeontologist who found one of the first dinosaur fossils and we will talk about how fossils are a key source of information when learning about dinosaurs. We will also look at different types of dinosaurs and the special features they had and why.

In **literacy** we will continue to work on ou<mark>r sen</mark>tence writing and including the features of a sentence (a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop). We will continue to hear lots of sounds in words to write phonetically plausible words. We will take part in handwriting sessions each week to help develop the correct letter formation.

In maths, we will recap our learning on subitising. We will then be introduced to addition and subtraction. We will use models such as part-part-wholes fram<mark>es</mark> to help work out additi<mark>on</mark> and subtraction equations and then move on to counting forwards and backwards on a number line to find the answer. We will also be able to read and write addition and subtraction equations.

In **phonics** we will be introduced to Phase 3 phonemes which includes digraphs and trigraphs. We will practise recognising, reading and writing words including these sounds every day. We will also learn the phase 3 super power words - he, she, we, me, be, you, all, are, her, was, they and my.


English - reading

Writing

We've been working on writing simple phrases and sentences 'It is big.' / 'It can run.'

Perhaps you could have a go at writing; a few facts about your favourite type of dinosaur, something you and your pet dinosaur might do together or a mini story inspired by Andy's adventures (BBC I-player)

Funky fingers

In school, lots of our activities focus on building up the muscles in our fingers and hands. This helps develop our fine motor skills.

Maths

Addition; Roll a dice and build a tower of that many blocks. Roll the dice again and add that many blocks. How many blocks in total?

Subtraction: Pick a number card and count out that many cheerio's. Roll a dice and eat that many of the cheerio's. How many cheerio's are left?

Reading

Each week in school, we are learning new phonics sounds to help us in our reding journey. Practising reading at home helps us to embed new learning and build on this as well as building our confidence as early readers too!

We recommend for your child to read a couple of pages around 3x a week.
