THE CIRCUS

In Autumn 1, KS1 will be welcoming the circus to town. We will be learning a range of art skills (including mixing tints and tones, drawing lines and using different mediums to add texture) to produce a circus scene. As well as creating a beautiful piece of art, the child will learn about the history of the circus and about the different entertainers that work there. To help them with their learning, we will be having a visit from a performer from Circus Sensible to teach us some circus skills.

In English, all of the children will be kicking off the year by writing some circus poetry. The Y1s are then going to learn about Julia Donaldson's 'The Singing Mermaid'. The Y2s are going to write a recount based on their experience of learning different circus skills.



In maths, all of the children will start by building on their knowledge of place value and number.
