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New Topic

We are excited to introduce this half term's new topic - Mythical Creatures. We are going to immerse ourselves in the wonderful world of dragons. Home Learning

In KST we encourage the children to read at home as much as possible - ideally, **3 to 5 times a week**. This is to support the reading we do with the children in school

We also encourage them to **practise key maths skills** through weekly homework sheets. These will be sent home on a Monday and should be returned to class teachers by the Friday of that week so that they can be exchanged for Dojos

All children in school still have access to the EdShed, which is a great way of practise phonics, spelling and maths skills.
