## New Topic



This half term we will be exploring the brilliance of bread. We will be tasting bread from different parts of the world and using what we find to create our own delicious recipes. We are then going to learn the skills *kneaded* (that was a bread pun not a spelling mistake) to make bread from scratch, review our first attempts to improve the taste and look, before making our final loaves.

We are going to celebrate the end of this unit by opening our own pop up bakery for parents and carers towards the end of the half term (you will receive an email with more details specific to your child's class).

In English, the children will be writing instructions that they can follow to make their own bread. We will be focusing on using adverbs of time, capital letters and full stops.

In maths, the year 1s will be revisiting place value to further hone their skills before moving onto volume and capacity.

The year 2s will be moving to looking at fractions using a variety of resources and bar models. Keep an eye out for further details on our Parent Maths workshop that will be taking place this half term where you can find out all about how we teach Maths in KS1 and ways to further support your child.

## Home Learning

Please continue to read with your child as frequently as possible (ideally 3 to 5 times per) week and complete the weekly maths homework sheet.
