

FIRST STEPS IN READING:

HOW BEST TO SUPPORT CHILDREN IN FS2.

First, we teach the children to recognise individual letters and the 'sound' that they make.


Then we start to put 2 or 3 letters together and teach how to break the words down into individual letters (segment) and then put these sounds together (blend) to read the word as a whole.

Daily phonics sessions in Fs2

We start on Phase 2 sounds in FS


- Taught in FS2 from September to Christmas
- Letter names (sung as part of the alphabet song) are different to the sound that letter makes in words.
- The pictures on the sound mat help us to identify the 'pure' sound that each letter makes
- The letters are not taught in the order of the alphabet they are taught in the order shown on this mat








Daily phonics sessions in Fs2

We move onto Phase 3 sounds in FS

- Taught in FS2 from Christmas until the summer break
- Within phase 3, we begin to find out that 2+ letters can make one sound. We can't hear either of the letters sounds discreetly. *ie we can't hear c or h in ch.*
- 2 letters that make one sound = a di-graph
- 3 letters that make one sound = a tri-graph





until Christmas. Once your child is familiar with different sounds, try putting those sounds together to form short words so that sound recognition and early reading go hand in hand.

Phase 2 phonic sound cards; here are the Phase 2 sounds your child will be working on in school





When your child is secure with Phase 2, they will move onto red books that are focussed on Phase 3 sounds.

They will then progress onto yellow books.
This is when we start to work on building early comprehension and not just focussing on word reading.

Fostering a love of reading

- Story time every day many of us will have fond memories of this (don't forget the voices)
- Having books available to read or share lending library
- Setting up a space for reading
- Regular visits to the library to borrow books
- Talking about the books you read
- Bring the books to life by letting them spill over into imaginative play
- Making up your own stories (verbal)
- Writing stories and 'publishing books' to add to your own bookshelf
- Encouraging reading all around on signs or food packets
- Adding subtitles to their favourite TV shows
- Reading shopping lists
- Sharing a daily joke from a joke book



Sharing a wide selection of books

These books are available in the hallway of school and are for you to read to your child. They are not matched to the phonics level your child is accessing in phonics sessions so they will be too challenging to read by themselves.


